Message from Fr. Shaiju

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus,

Today, we often become uneasy when our comforts, pride, or personal dreams are challenged. The words of the Gospel on this 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time trouble us even more, for Jesus calls us to follow Him wholeheartedly, taking up our cross and walking behind Him without complaint.

Discipleship is not about adding Jesus to *my* plans, but it is about allowing *His* plan to become my life. It means choosing Him even when it hurts, trusting Him when the path feels dark, and loving Him above all else. True discipleship is costly, it may appear as losing the world and its comforts, but in reality, it is gaining Christ eternally.

To “carry our cross” is not simply to endure hardships; it is to make Christ the centre of my every choice, my every relationship, and my every plan. Our faith is not a hobby or a part-time activity. It is the foundation of who we are and the measure of our priorities. Jesus does not ask for something from us. He asks for everything. It is not to burden us, but to free us. When Christ is first, everything else finds its proper place. He tells us clearly that we cannot cling to half-hearted loyalties or live by convenience if we wish to be His true disciples. The Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary celebrated on September 8th, reminds us that discipleship begins with a **yes**. Mary lived her whole life centred on God’s will, showing us that putting Christ first often requires surrendering our own plans.

Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, let us ask ourselves: *What am I still clinging to that prevents me from giving myself completely to Jesus? Do my plans take precedence over doing the will of the Lord?* May the Lord give us the courage to answer with Mary’s faith-filled **yes** and to follow Him without reserve.

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) is the process through which interested unbaptized adults and older children (catechumens) are introduced to the Roman Catholic faith and become members of the Catholic Church. The OCIA pro-gram is a time of reflection, prayer, study, and discernment leading to the celebration of becoming full members at the Easter Vigil.
